

Thirtieth Week in Ordinary Time



We are building to a climax in Matthew's Gospel as we come to the end of the questioning and probing of the religious authorities in their pursuit of something on which to hang accusations of sacrilege against Jesus. As winter approaches and the season of Advent comes ever closer there are only a few short weeks remaining of this, possibly the most difficult year in the recent life of the church, and the season of Hope is on the horizon, waiting for us. First, we must follow Matthew's Gospel to the gates of Jerusalem and then celebrate the great Feast of Christ the King at the end of next month. Today we celebrate the Greatest Commandment. *"You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind and you must love your neighbour as yourself"*. In the passage from Exodus Moses passes on God's Word to the people. These are practical instructions dealing with some of the injustices which are still significant in today's world. There are warnings about our treatment of strangers, widows, and orphans. How often do we treat migrants as if they had no right to look for a better life, for shelter and a safe place to raise a family? How many among us have ancestors who were once migrants seeking these same things? Why should the poorest in society, the single mothers, the children in care, the unemployed, the homeless, be treated less well than those with the advantages of employment and good housing? There are many injustices in this our safe, comfortable, prosperous society. Loving our neighbour does not only mean the people living next door, it covers all of humanity and their wants and needs. Saint Paul reminds the people of Thessalonica that they should follow the example they were shown by the actions of Himself and his companions. They are to be an inspiration to those who live in their country and, by living as followers of our Lord, they will bring more people to faith in Christ. The church in Europe is failing, practice is falling in almost every country, the best way to bring more people to Christ is by setting an example by our lives today, then we may win more hearts for Our Lord. Jesus silences the Pharisees when he quotes to them the greatest commandment. They cannot question Him on His Word. If this Commandment has so much power, and it has, then it should be the cornerstone on which we should build our lives. **David Frank**

Diploma in Pastoral Ministry and Leadership

Once again, this year the Diocese, in partnership with the Archdiocese of Liverpool and Wrexham Diocese, are offering a Diploma in Pastoral Ministry and Leadership. The Diploma is a combination of Online Learning and a series of leadership workshops, leading to a Loyola University Chicago Certificate and a series of Liverpool Hope CPD Awards.
