Trust is a basic need in people's lives. Where there is no trust, life becomes very difficult, all your hopes and dreams can turn to dust if there is nothing in which you can trust.

Jeremiah faced this problem in his time. The people had stopped trusting in the Lord and now they were beset by enemies on all sides. He begs the people not to trust in the promises of mortal men, their words are as dry and useless as the scrub in the wastelands. Trust in the Lord, he urges them. Those who turn to God are like the tree by the waterside, they shall be fruitful even in the year of drought.

Paul calls to us to place our trust in the risen Lord. Only through faith in Him can we come to eternal life. It is through his death and resurrection that we too are freed from our sins and can be called children of God.

Jesus comes to a large gathering of people with His apostles, those He has chosen to journey with Him in His ministry. He speaks to the crowds, those seeking healing, seeking guidance, seeking hope. He speaks of his mission, to care for the poor, the lost, the suffering. He calls down judgement on those who have wealth that they do not share; they have their reward on earth. He asks for their trust. For every blessing there is a curse, only by trusting in God can we find the road to eternal life. **David Frank**
