

Humility is a very difficult virtue; to be humble in our turbulent world is to be associated with those who are soft hearted, easy to push around. In our dog eats dog world the humble are trod upon and ignored. If you were to ask a parent which quality they would want in their children, humility will be very low on their list. However, the Kingdom of God prizes humility over almost all other virtues: in the Bible it is a virtue to be prized.

Humility is the opposite of pride; pride is a sin because it blinds the proud man and prevents him from acting with favour towards others; humility recognises the gifts of the poor; it sees goodness in everything. Pride does not see goodness except in itself. It is hard for a proud man to recognise God in those he meets, the humble man sees God in everything.

Take the first reading for example; it is a passage about two people, one who is humble and gentle in carrying out his business and one who is a lavish giver. The first man lives his life in the same way whether he is faced with good news or bad news. His attitude does not change, he remains gentle and loving. The lavish giver however gives from what he has in surplus. He does not give out of love but for attention.

Many times, in the New Testament, we read a passage where Jesus is sharing a meal. Sometimes He eats with the rich, other times he shares bread and fishes with the multitudes or with the poor and the sinners. On each occasion He takes the opportunity to teach those who are present. In the parable of the Wedding Feast Jesus tries to teach the Pharisees about the virtue of humility; they are seated at the highest table, they expect high positions in the Kingdom of Heaven, but Jesus teaches them that, unless they become like the poor and humble, they will not enter the Kingdom. He urges them to seek the lowly place so that their real qualities will be recognised, and they will rise through these qualities and not because of who they are. No one has a right to be accepted into the Kingdom; we are judged by what we do, not who we are. David Frank

Audio System & LOOP Systems for Parishioners who are Hard of Hearing: At St Brendan's we are trialing larger output speakers at the front of church. Please let Fr Alf or the Parish Office know if you notice any changes in sound quality.

Both churches are fitted with induction LOOP systems. Due to different cable routes and building geometry, the LOOP at St John's gives much better results. The Choir Loft at St Brendan's is served by its own LOOP system which performs very well.

At St Brendan's, the physical LOOP cable runs around the edge of the body of the church at skirting board level (as this is the only suitable place for it). Because of this, the LOOP signal at St Brendan's (in the central aisle) is not strong whereas around the perimeter of the church it is.

Whilst there are costly technical solutions to improve the signal, LOOP users at St Brenda's are encouraged to sit in pews where the signal is strongest, this includes both the rear of the church and close to the sides of the Church. Thank you.
