

The First Sunday of Lent



The Temptation of Our Lord is the theme of the First Sunday of Lent. As we begin this season we are called to reflect on this period of His life and to see how the world we face can be made better by the changes we can make in our lives. Lent gives us an opportunity to look back at the choices we have made and forward to see how we can fulfil our dreams and aspirations in the future. Lent should not be a time of sacrifice, of giving up things, but of new life, of taking up a new perspective of how things could be.

The Garden of Eden was a paradise where our first human forbearers wandered through its leafy groves. They knew not sin, but the serpent of doubt, that worm of jealousy, came to them, twisting their view of the world. They knew not to touch the fruit of the tree in the centre of the garden, but the prospect of knowledge was too alluring, and they fell into sin.

Paul acknowledges that sin came into the world through the actions of one man, Adam, and, with sin, death, but that Christ came to confront sin and destroy death through His sacrifice on the cross. Jesus came to save us from our sins and to show us the way to live without sin and defeat death by rising with Him to eternal life. He gave us the gift of grace, the strength He gives us to live our lives in His way and turn away from sin and back to Him.

Jesus went into the wilderness to find Himself. He needed to test His human nature to prepare Himself for what was to come. He found his adversity, the devil, waiting to test His resolve. He must have prepared Himself in prayer before facing his opponent. Prayer gives us the strength to face the devils that we find in our lives and with the gift of grace we have the power to become righteous. Whatever we need to change in our lives, God gives us the grace to make those changes. Lent is an opportunity to repair the past, concentrate on the future, and to make new choices and restart our journey with Him.
