2 April 2023 Palm Sunday of the Passion of The Lord

Holy Week is a reflection of life, we never seem to be prepared for what is to come, even when we know what is to happen, it is a week full of familiar voices, repeating the same events, yet each time we come to it anew. There is a great need to listen, reflect and absorb the lessons of this Holy week.

Isaiah recognised the needs of his calling as God's prophet to the people of Israel. Not for him the role of a subject, his part was to speak clearly to the people, to lead them away from their sins, their mistakes, their reluctance to follow the way of the Lord. His voice was strong, his message clear, he was to raise weary hearts, to strengthen the faith of the people, to bring them back to the love of God. He knows the path he must tread, a path that will lead to rejection and pain, yet he cannot turn away, he has been given a disciple's task and he is steadfast in his duties.

Paul seeks to explain a crucified Christ to the people of his time. He can see the contradictions of his teaching; how can he explain the power of Christ when it appears to be mired in weakness. This passage in his letter to the Philippians is a masterpiece; he draws a picture of the absolute acceptance by Jesus of His mission to bring all people to believe in the love of God. Christ strips himself of all power to become the lowliest of God's creation. He suffers a horrendous death so that all people can be released, forgiven, brought to salvation, reborn into new life with His heavenly Father.

Matthews Gospel brings fresh insight into our understanding of the sacrifice of Christ. We may be concerned that we fail Christ by our sins, our omissions, our reluctance to stand up for our faith, yet we meet, in Matthew's Gospel, Judas and Peter, both of whom betray our Lord in different ways, and we see His apostles falling asleep when they are needed by Him in His agony in the garden. The lesson we can take from this Holy Week is that no matter what our failings we are loved by God and all we need to do is ask, with a trusting heart, for the forgiveness, won for us by the sacrifice of Jesus, and that forgiveness will be freely given to us. *David Frank*
