# 30 July 2023 Seventeenth Sunday Ordinary Time



Wisdom is a gift from God. The wise man acts and speaks with humility, he does not shout, he speaks to the heart of the matter and his words touch something within us. Solomon was a young man and great authority was set upon his shoulders. He followed his father David, as King of Israel, and his main task was to unify the people into one nation again. He knew the enormity of his task and so he prayed to the Lord for the gift of wisdom. God looked into the heart of Solomon and saw that there was goodness there and so He answered Solomon's plea and gave him "a heart wise and shrewd" and the gift of "discerning judgement".

There is wisdom also in Paul's letter to the Romans. He is writing to the Christians of Rome and reminding them that each one has been chosen by God for a certain purpose. They are facing opposition, but he urges them to work for the glory of God for, through their work, they will obtain their eternal reward.

What was it like sitting with the crowds on those Galilean Hills listening to Our Lord speaking and teaching the people gathered around Him. He teaches through Parables; using examples of everyday life to gain their understanding, speaking to the hearts of the people, giving them hope, raising them from their despondency, making a new creation. By using parables, which can be told and retold among the people of the Holy Land, His voice reaches many who cannot be present but who are brought to understanding through His stories.

Often, when I struggle to understand the storms of daily life, a parable comes to mind, and I can find some peace in these simple stories. The field that holds the treasure reminds me not to hide the treasure I have found but to share it with others in their daily struggles. The pearl of great price reminds me that my faith is precious, and nothing can come between me and my faith in Christ. The fishermen's catch is a warning that not everything in this world is good and that I must follow Christ and share his love with others to avoid being tossed over the side of His boat. Finally, I have come to realise that, just like the householder. I must search for the wisdom of the world, both old and new, and use these gifts to build the Kingdom of Heaven. David Frank


