Transfiguration of the Lord

Daniel 7: 9-10, 13-14 Psalm 96 2 Peter 1: 16-19 Matthew 17: 1-9

In Matthew's Gospel, today's passage stands, like a bookend, at the climax of the ministry of Jesus.

Matthew begins His ministry with the Baptism in the Jordan and ends here, with the Transfiguration. Jesus moves from the depths of the Jordan riverbed to the heights of Mount Tabor and the greatness of God is revealed.

Each of us have a vision of heaven, the place where we hope to go when our earthly life comes to its natural end. The vision of Daniel is a stunning insight into the way the Old Testament writers viewed this wonderful place. The Book of Daniel is associated closely with the Book of the Apocalypse, both were born out of periods of persecution when first the Jews and then the Christians suffered from the actions of their powerful overlords. The scenes from both books give a glimpse of the power of our God. The "Son of Man" is the chosen one, Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Saviour.

Peter was, perhaps, the closest friend and companion of Jesus. His understanding grew from admiration, through awe, to a clear certainty that Jesus was the Son of God.

Today's passage is a reflection from that day on Mount Tabor when Peter and his friends received their own vision of heaven and heard the Father's voice "This is my Son, the beloved".

There is a phrase here which describes Peter's journey to faith and his love of scripture, especially the prophets - "a lamp for lighting the way through the dark until the dawn comes, and the morning star rises in your minds": this is the power of scripture, a sure light, that leads to understanding.

Today's Gospel is a description of heaven in all its simplicity. Jesus invites us to go with Him.

His glory is revealed to us. Others, who have gone before, are there, they are friends of Our

Lord. It is a place of peace, filled with the love of God. Jesus touches us, He assures us "Do not

be afraid". The message of the Transfiguration fills our minds and hearts with a clear understanding that Jesus is Lord.

Let us pray that, in each of us, Peter's morning star will rise, and our love of God will blossom in the light of day. David Frank
