


Parish of Corpus Christi, Bolton

19 November 2023 Thirty-Third Sunday Ordinary Time





Today's readings are about gifts and talents. In the first reading, using the example of a perfect wife, the writer of Proverbs describes her virtues; faithful, industrious, compassionate, and loving. These virtues are a reflection of the work of a disciple, somebody who is dependable, always ready to help, a good worker, one who does not forget the poor and those who are in need. One who is wise and who is worthy of praise.

What is a disciple; put quite simply it is "one who follows". We follow Christ and his teaching; part of that teaching reminds us that we are all servants and servants are asked to bring whatever talent or gift they may possess and use it for the benefit of others. Our faith is a reflection of our daily life; we should live in such a way that anyone hearing our words or seeing our actions can see a reflection of the life of Christ. Being a disciple is far from easy, there are many times we may want to run and hide from our responsibilities; we are not always faithful disciples, but God forgives us our failings and takes us back no matter how often we fail.

The Gospel reading is the parable of the talents. We each have gifts and talents given to us by God. Some have a great talent, others may excel only in small things, but we all have something to give. In the parable the master rewards those who use their talents to create wealth but punishes those who waste their talent and do nothing.

There are many people, men and women, who work in our churches, some are seen, many others work unseen, all are using their gifts to benefit the church. Many did not wait to be asked but saw a need and answered the call to fill that need. Perhaps you can see a need for your particular skills or talents? Have you ever thought "I could help with that"; if you have, then speak to someone and take the first step to ensure that your gifts and talents are not wasted. Then, when you come to your heavenly reward, you may hear the Father words "Well done, good and faithful servant". David Frank

Fire Safety - Appeal for Fire Wardens for St Brendan's: To keep our parishioners safe we need volunteers to act as Fire Wardens. The fire wardens' job is to ensure, in the event of a fire, that the alarm is sounded, and everyone safely leaves the building. We hope that existing stewards & fire wardens will continue to volunteer. There is no requirement to be on a rota, we simply need a group of parishioners who know what to do in case of a fire. Training will take place at St Brendan's at 10.15am before the 11am Mass on Sunday 3 December and at 4.15pm before the Vigil Mass on Saturday 9 December. We invite fit and able parishioners to volunteer, especially as some parishioners with mobility difficulties might need your assistance in the case of fire. Health & Safety - St Brendan's

<u>Sanctuary Steps</u> The flooring and steps leading to the sanctuary are not easy to differentiate. Simple brass handrails are being installed on Monday to create easier access. In the meanwhile, please take extra care. The votive candle stands have been moved for easier access. Please ensure that the offertory bags are placed in front of the lectern, not on the altar steps.

Access Road: This road has many potholes which may be a hazard to car users and pedestrians. The road is unadopted, so no-one has responsibility for its upkeep. The parish and school have expended significant sums of money on repairs, only to find that the road has further deteriorated. Representations are being made to Bolton Council to seek funding or repairs. Parishioners are advised to take special care when using the road.

Paved Pathway from St Brendan's Church to the School: The pathway leading from the car park to the school, which is heavily used by the school children and parents, is becoming damaged and worn especially due to adverse weather and surface water. To reduce the risks of slip and trips hazard all users are advised to take special care when using the pathway. The parish is seeking quotations to carry out the necessary repairs.
