Relay of Prayer

It will be transferred to St John's on the morning of Friday 2 March (with an assembly about Puerto Rico) and then on to St Columba's that afternoon (with an assembly about Côte d'Ivoire).

Exact times for these transfers are hard to determine, though it is hoped that the torch will arrive in St John's soon after the Friday morning Mass (i.e. about 10am). Parishioners are invited to keep an eye out for the torch as it passes through the area – and give a wave to the bearers!
